Background

Aroids are grown globally for their ornamental beauty but they also possess unprecedented potential as a food crop. They are also used in indigenous medicinal preparations for various ailments. Edible aroids are herbaceous plants, most with enlarged storage organs. The edible aroids that are cultivated and used as food in various parts of the tropics, including India are: Colocasia esculenta (L) Schott commonly referred as taro, old cocoyam, eddoe or dasheen; Xanthosoma spp., generally referred as tannia or new cocoyam or cocoyam; Alocasia spp. commonly referred as giant taro, Alocasia macrorrhiza is the most prevalent species but A. india, A. fornicata and A. cucullata are also cultivated to a limited extent; Amorphophallus paeoniifolius, commonly referred as elephant foot yam is the most popular cultivated species for food purpose while A. konjac is cultivated for extraction of glucomannan, konjac flour etc; Cyrtosperma merkusii Schott, commonly referred as swamp taro, is also cultivated to a limited extent.

Although most of the above mentioned aroids are important from food production point of view, Amorphophallus paeoniifolius and A. konjac deserve special mention in view of their untapped potential, which needs to be exploited for increased healthy food production. The present conference is proposed to be organized to share and discuss the latest developments in aroid research across the globe and formulate strategies and collaborative action plan to exploit the potential of aroids as food and to introduce them in new areas.

Who are the participants?

The seminar aims to attract scientists, extension workers, food processors, smallscale entrepreneurs, policy and decision makers, NGOs and farmers. The emerging issues related to aroids will be discussed and road map for improving production and utilization of aroids will be developed.

LANGUAGE

The official language of the Global Aroids Conference will be English.

ORAL PRESENTATIONS

Each session will have one or two lead papers, followed by oral presentations. Thirty minutes will be allotted for lead paper and 15 minutes for oral paper presentation (including 5 minutes for discussion). Oral presentations should be made in the Microsoft Power Point.

POSTER PRESENTATION

Space of 90 cm height x 75 cm width will be provided for each poster. Poster pertaining to the sessions on each day will be exhibited and contributors are expected to be present near their poster stand for discussion with viewers during the stipulated period.









GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

- Posters will be displayed on free standing boards. Each poster should have the size of 90 cm height x 75 cm width.
- Posters must include the name(s) and affiliations of the author(s) and preferably a photograph of the presenter to facilitate identification at the conference.
- While preparing the poster, kindly present enough data to support conclusions or to explain the point(s) you wish to make.
- Please do have a short and clear conclusion. Data should be kept to a minimum in favour of diagrams, figures and photographs.
- All text lettering should be large enough to be legible at a distance of 1.5 m.
 Lettering used for title should be a minimum of 24-point size, preferably Times
 New Roman font. All text must be in English.
- Photographs, figures and diagrams should be large enough to be read at a distance of 1.5 m.
- The abstract of the conference will indicate a poster number and the session may be different from the session you proposed.
- Self adhesive posters are preferred. However, the necessary facilities for displaying the posters will be extended by the organizers.

GUIDELINES FOR FULL PAPER SUBMISSION

- The full paper length may be 15-20 A4 size pages (one side), double spaced, inclusive of tables, figures etc.)
- Depending on the nature of the paper, it should be sub sectioned into Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusion and References cited (for experimental studies) or separated by appropriate headings (for general papers).
- While preparing the full paper, the abstract page (as submitted) should appear
 as such, followed by the text matter in Times New Roman font. For the subheadings font size of 12 point in bold should be used. Please do not indent
 the first line of each para. Each para should be separated by one blank space.
 Figures and Tables should be inserted wherever needed.
- The full paper may be sent through email to the Organizing Secretary and a
 hard copy with original photographs and figures may be submitted (for oral
 as well as poster presentations) in MS Word document along with CD at the
 time of the conference. This will facilitate timely publication of the Proceedings
 of the Conference.





TRAVEL TO BHUBANESWAR

Bhubaneswar airport is well connected with all Indian State capitals. All major airlines are operating from here. Bhubaneswar is also well connected by road and rail to various cities in India. Bhubaneswar airport and railway station are located in the heart of the city, 3 km away from conference venue. Organizers will make arrangements for transport of delegates from airport/railway station to their hotels.

VISA/PASSPORTS

All overseas delegates are requested to apply to the nearest Indian Embassy/Consulate for getting their VISA. VISA related information may be found from official website of Indian Embassy or Consulate in your country. All foreign nationals must have a valid VISA. VISA is issued only by Indian Consular Offices / Embassies functioning abroad which may be extended on arrival. Delegates from countries viz., Nigeria, Tanzania, Ghana, Kenya, Uganda, Colombia, Brazil and Peru have to produce yellow card to the Indian embassy for getting VISA. Please ensure that the details as requested in Bio-data and passport details Form are provided early so as to enable us to get the letters issued by the Ministry of External Affairs for issuing the Visa by the respective Embassies/Consulates.
